#### SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

All Attendance Rolls are marked electronically. It is essential that if you are late you MUST sign in your child at the office before they go to the classroom. If you arrive after the starting time of 8.50am they will be marked absent unless signed in at the office. If your child is late you will need to escort them to the school office to complete a late slip. Arriving late to class obviously disrupts the class so it would be appreciated if every effort could be made to arrive at school no later 8.50am. Children are expected to attend all school activities, on time. Regular attendance helps your child: develop skills needed to access the world of work and other opportunities; learn the importance of punctuality and routines; make and keep friendships.

What a pleasure it was seeing all of the students of St Vincent's during Week 1. You would have noticed library books coming home in school bags on Wednesday and

Thursday. During our library lessons we spoke about picking books that we could either read by ourselves, read with someone or have read to us. I encourage you to engage in conversations with your child about their choice of book and if it was a good fit for them. Here are some questions to ask your children after they have read their library books.

- Can you describe your favourite part of the book?
- Was there anything in the book that surprised you?
- If you could be a character in the book for one day, who would you chose to be?
- Were there any new words that you learned from reading the book?
- What do you think the author wanted us to take away from this book?
- Do you have a friend who you think would like this book? Why?
- Does this author have any other books? Have you read any of them?

#### FROM THE ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL

At the beginning of a new school year it is important to consider all the pieces of the puzzle which combined will lead, hopefully, to a successful year. Success, of course means, different things to different people. We all bring a variety of interests, perspectives, gifts and talents to our learning. At St Vincent's we value progress. Progress is measured by how much 'gain' or 'growth' individual students make over time. All students have a different starting point. It is important that we acknowledge this and recognise progress as an important measure of success.

Goal setting is an important ingredient to assist students to gauge their progress. When a student is involved in setting their own learning goals, they have a clear path to success. When an individual student sets their own goals, they develop an understanding of what they want to achieve and design strategies to achieve their goals. Simply put, goal setting allows students to make learning self-directed, purposeful and organised. According to research on the Grade Power Learning website (https://gradepowerlearning.com/importance-of-goal-setting-forstudents/) there are seven main ways goal setting can help a child succeed:

- 1. Provides A Clear Path To Success
- 2. Teaches Time Management & Preparedness
- 3. Increases Motivation
- 4. Measures Progress
- 5. Gives Focus & Purpose
- 6. Boosts Self-Confidence
- 7. Provides Challenges



GOAL SETTING

Over the next couple of weeks, all students at St Vincent's will be actively involved in developing individual learning goals. Parents are encouraged to talk with their child about the goal setting progress. Goal setting is most successful when goals are revisited and revised regularly, and progress is gauged. I look forward to having the opportunity to talk with students about their goals and witnessing their commitments towards attaining them.

# WE are a Community who shares God's Love

Welcome to week 2.

As mentioned in last week's newsletter, this term St Vincent's School and community will be exploring the meaning of CARITAS ~ God is Love.

A very familiar piece of Scripture used to understand God's love is 1 Corinthians 13: 4 - 7. St Paul wrote this letter to the early Christians in Corinth as they needed guidance to understand what love actually meant.

Below are a few key points from this Scripture, paraphrased for students to understand.

**1.** Love is patient and kind: Paul is saying to share and give with the right heart and with love. He encourages each of us to give freely and not resent what we are giving.

**2.** Love is not jealous: Love isn't jealous of what others have, and if you have things that others want, you shouldn't make your friends jealous because you have it.

**3.** Love does not boast or brag: Love is not proud or big headed. That also means boasting or bragging. Accept what you have, what God has given you. Be happy, not "I want this and that".

**4. Love is not rude or mean:** Love does not behave rudely. Love is not impolite or mean. Love doesn't do things that we'll regret or be ashamed of later.

**5. Love cares about other people's needs:** Love does not seek it's own. Love doesn't look out for their own interests or just themselves. That also includes grabbing things from people. Or interrupting when someone is talking. Love cares about other people's needs.

**6.** Love controls temper and isn't angry: Love is not provoked. That means that love doesn't become angry easily. Love is *forgiving*. Take time to let your temper cool down. Don't hold grudges.

7. Love thinks good thoughts and is happy when others do what is right: Love rejoices in the truth.

8 Love accepts all things; has trust and hope and never gives up:

Love bears all things. (Love accepts and protects.)

Love believes all things. (Love trusts)

Love hopes all things. (Love always has hope.)

Love never fails. (Love puts up with things and never gives up.) If you love someone or something, you never stop trying. Love is patient, willing to listen and take the time to pay attention.
